The engine was not competitive straightaway lacking horsepower and we had to deal with it. We tried many things to avoid the lack of performance, but it could not be overcome. I've learned a lot about the oval racing discipline, and I've enjoyed it tremendously, surrounded by fantastic people, and passionate fans. I leave with a lot of respect for the Indy 500, an event I've followed from afar for many years. I want to return next year, I will start to prepare now."
